CROSSROADS OF THE WEST – PBR Unleash The Beast prepares to invade Salt Lake City, Utah’s Delta Center Feb. 6-7 during the eighth event of the 2026 premier series campaign. This weekend’s PBR Salt Lake City presented by Busch Light begins on Friday night at 8 p.m. MT with the first round before concluding on Saturday night at 8 p.m. MT with the second slate and championship round, set to begin at 8 p.m. MT. This weekend’s action is available to viewers on Paramount+ with the Monster Energy Team Challenge (Kansas City vs. Missouri and Arizona vs. Oklahoma) carried on the CBS Television Network on Feb. 8 at 12 p.m. ET

ROCK, PAPER, SCISSORS – After the season’s first two sets of rider cuts following UTB events in New York (Jan. 9-11) and most recently Tampa (Jan. 23-24), the third wave of cuts loom large following this weekend’s showdown in Salt Lake City (Feb. 6-7). Riders sitting below the No. 35 rank, excluding cowboys with remaining exemptions, will find themselves relegated to Pendleton Whisky Velocity Tour (PWVT) competition, thus paving the way for said tour’s top-performing riders receiving a shot to make some noise on the sport’s grandest stage. After Andy Guzman turned in a UTB career-best 12th-place effort last weekend in Sacramento, California, during his 2026 premier series debut, the California native will need another favorable result this weekend in Salt Lake City to remain above the cutline.

Invites for this weekend include Ezekiel Mitchell and Jaxton Mortensen, who won recent PWVT events in Greenville, South Carolina, and Nampa, Idaho, respectively. Each rider makes his UTB season debut Friday. Additional invites from PWVT competition include Andy Guzman, Wyatt Rogers, Kase Hitt, Grayson Cole and Manoelito de Souza Junior, while Felipe Furlan and Heitor Santos Ferreira qualify for this weekend’s lineup via exemption status. Joao Ricardo Vieira represents the weekend’s lone alternate to make the draw in Salt Lake City, with No. 1 Dalton Kasel doctoring out of this weekend’s competition due to an injury sustained in Sacramento.

BIG BOOTS TO FILL – After 19 different riders met the requisite 8 during Friday’s opening round in Sacramento, the premier series pack combined for a season-high 26 qualified rides during Round 2 at Golden 1 Center in front of a sold-out crowd. The 26-ride mark represents the most successful outs recorded in a single premier series round since 2009. Overall, the weekend featured conversions from 35 of the event’s 45 participating riders, the most of the 2026 campaign, as the pack lapped its previous high of 29 cowboys making their way to the event leaderboard in Boston earlier this season. When all was said and done, 18 riders managed at least two conversions on the weekend, six more than the 12 cowboys who doubled down in New York City.

John Crimber – Earning his first premier series win of the season and fourth of the young rider’s career, No. 3 John Crimber brings plenty of momentum into Delta Center after producing a perfect 4-for-4 record last weekend in Sacramento. Topping the event leaderboard for the first time in 2026, Crimber edged out his good friend in Clay Guiton by .15 points in the aggregate, 351.85-351.70, by recording an 88.65-point conversion aboard Tigger during Sunday’s championship round. Originally getting his weekend started via a pair of conversions aboard Creedmore Precision (87.50 points) and Hookie Monster (88.40 points), Crimber secured his spot in the exclusive go courtesy of an 87.30-pointer dancing with Hot Sauce. After collecting a spicy 163 UTB points for the win, the 20-year-old phenom sits just 38.5 points behind No. 2 Guiton and 70 points behind No. 1 Dalton Kasel, set for a rematch dance against Snappy in Round 1.

Dalton Kasel – Earning his third-consecutive Top 5 placement as one of the hottest riders on tour, No. 1 Dalton Kasel exited Golden 1 Center with a fifth-place finish, which represented the No. 1-ranked rider’s fourth Top 5 honors of the season. Entering Sunday’s championship round atop the leaderboard, Kasel selected a date with Oyster Creek Brawler courtesy of the first pick in the short round bull draft. Eventually dispatched in 3.78 seconds during Sunday’s final out, Kasel was met with an event-high effort, as the talented bovine took home the highest bull score of the weekend, scored 45.35 points. Kasel’s conversions in the opening three rounds, including strikes aboard Wild Mustard (84.55 points), Sour

Patch (90.55 points) and Walk Hard (88.40 points) were good enough to earn the Muleshoe, Texas, native 99 UTB points as he remains atop the UTB standings, currently 31.5 UTB points ahead of No. 2 Clay Guiton. Using his 90.55-point ride on Sour Patch in Round 2 to capture his second round win of 2026, “Mr. 90 Point” remains tied with Sage Steele Kimzey and Clay Guiton atop the 90-point ride club with two apiece, albeit the only rider to meet the mark in Sacramento. However, after limping off the dirt following his short round go, Kasel is set to miss action in Salt Lake City due to injury.

Clay Guiton – Arguably the only cowboy hotter than Kasel lately is No. 2 Clay Guiton, who’s managed runner-up efforts during each of the tour’s last two stops in Sacramento and Tampa, Florida, respectively. Joining Crimber as the only other man to go 4-for-4 at Golden 1 Center last weekend, Guiton brings a six-out ride streak into this weekend’s showcase at Delta Center, officially successful in six of his last seven outs. Coming just .25 points short of what would’ve been his tour-leading third 90-pointer, Guiton was scored 89.75 points during his championship round dance with American Made last Sunday. Logging 87.30 (Black Tie), 87 (Apple Juicing) and 87.65-point (Dirty Honey) conversions as one of six riders to record flashy 3-for-3 starts to the weekend, the 20-year-old star continues to show off his bulls and skillset alike. Bringing his 13-for-20 (65%) record to Salt Lake City, he sits tied with Kasel for the most qualified rides on tour while continuing to own the second-highest ride percentage, trailing only Kasel’s 13-for-19 (68.42%) slate to begin the season.

Sage Steele Kimzey – Consistency is key in the sport of bull riding, specifically for a 31-year-old contender in No. 4 Sage Steele Kimzey, who continues to chase down what would be his career-first PBR World Championship. Having recorded at least one qualified ride in six of the tour’s first seven showcases, he’s been one of the most consistent cowboys on tour in 2026 and continued that trend last weekend in Sacramento via a seventh-place finish. As one of seven riders to record three or more conversions, Kimzey could’ve earned a higher placement had he not settled for a 75.05-point score following a Round 2 out aboard I’m Him, declining the re-ride option in favor of a guaranteed 2-for-2 start to the weekend. Able to advance to 3-for-3 on Sunday courtesy of an 86.80-pointer on Noslaw Extrasauce after accepting a re-ride opportunity following his initial attempt aboard Schliterbahn, the decorated PRCA Champion was unable to complete his perfect run, forced into a touch just 2.21 seconds into his showdown against El Patro in the championship round. Earning 39 UTB points for his fifth Top 15 finish of the season, he sits 33 points behind No. 3 John Crimber, but will be out of competition this weekend in Salt Lake City due to injury.

Jess Lockwood – The tour’s top-ranked rider in Kasel may be out of commission this weekend but the premier series pack gets two-time World Champion Jess Lockwood back in the fold on Friday night, entering the tour’s eighth stop ranked No. 10 overall. Appearing in just three events so far this season, the veteran won his first event title since 2020 two weeks ago in Tampa but was forced to miss last weekend’s showdown in Sacramento due to injury. Primed for a dance with Siagon in Round 1, he’s got a chance to build on his event-topping momentum and remains just 95 points outside the Top 5 despite limited time on tour. Across his five conversions this season, he’s averaging 89.27 points, with three of his five qualified rides earning the cowboy a round win. When he strikes, he’s hot, and should be well-rested for Round 1.

Cort McFadden – Having participated in just four contests in 2026, No. 14 Cort McFadden has made the most of his limited time on tour so far since beginning his season Jan. 9 at Madison Square Garden. Now 7-for-11 on the season after turning in a campaign-best fifth-place appearance last weekend in Sacramento, the 21-year-old owns the third-highest riding percentage (63.64%) of all cowboys thanks to a pair of Top 6 placements earned within his first four contests attended. One of seven riders to ride at least three bulls last weekend inside Golden 1 Center, the Novice, Texas, native went 3-for-4 overall, coming a mere .15 points short of Manoelito de Souza Junior, who finished fourth, and just 1.5 points behind No. 1 Kasel, who took home third-place honors. McFadden battles Uncle Pete in Friday’s opening round as he looks to stay hot and continue his ascension of the Unleash The Beast standings.

Jose Vitor Leme – Following a slow start to the season, three-time World Champion Jose Vitor Leme turned in his third-straight Top 15 showing in Sacramento courtesy of an eighth-place tie with Daniel Keeping via his 2-for-3 slate. The experienced cowboy was on pace for a fruitful finish after winning Round 1 with a season-best 89.20-point ride on Dirty Honey followed up by 88.30 points aboard Nefarious in the second round. However, when Sunday’s third perf rolled around, the veteran was banged up during a dance with Fire Fight, forcing Leme to doctor out of the short round. Having entered last weekend’s event ranked No. 37, the Brazilian improved to No. 29 and is set to give it a go Friday night against Kiowa Havoc as he looks to make up some additional ground in World Championship race.

MONSTER ENERGY TEAM CHALLENGE HITS HALFWAY POINT – The Monster Energy Team Challenge is being contested throughout the PBR Unleash The Beast (UTB) season, bringing a new layer of competition and added intensity to select UTB events. During 10 Unleash The Beast events, teams compete in two head-to-head games per event, featuring 4-on-4 matchups for a total of 16 outs per event.

In Salt Lake City on Friday night, the METC action begins with a Show Me State showdown between a pair of undefeated squads in the (2-0) Kansas City Outlaws and the (2-0) Missouri Thunder. The rivalrous entities are very familiar with each other at this point, and are sure to put on a show before paving way to Friday night's second game, which features a head-to-head battle between the veteran-guided (0-1) Arizona Ridge Riders and youthful (0-2) Oklahoma Wildcatters.

The teams, which will compete in the fifth season of the PBR Teams league from July - November, will accumulate wins and losses throughout the 10 Monster Energy Team Challenge events with the top four teams advancing to the METC Championship Tournament. The final four format in all three locations will feature one 7 x 7 head-to-head matchup per game (14 total outs).

The championship tournament will span three Unleash The Beast events during the stretch run of individual competition – Albuquerque (March 27), Billings (April 17), and the UTB regular season finale in Tacoma on April 24 – when the remaining teams will battle in head-to-head 7 x 7 games in an elimination format to determine the inaugural Monster Energy Team Challenge champion.

MORE PRECISE JUDGING AND SCORING – PBR has introduced a refined judging system for the 2026 season, shifting to tenth-point (.1) scoring for both riders and bulls to preserve the traditional structure while allowing judges to capture subtle performance differences that were previously obscured under the half-point model. A two-year study of more than 15,500 top-level rides showed that elite bulls deliver remarkably similar performances – 96% of bull scores over 19 fell between 20.0 and 22.0, and 81% cluster tightly between 20.5 and 21.5 –effectively limiting judges to just a few scoring “buckets.” The new increments let judges distinguish more precisely, such as scoring a bull 21.2 instead of being forced into 21.0 or 21.5, with the same nuance applied to rider dominance, control, and spurring. While ties may still occur, they should be far less common, and a built-in variance cap ensures a rider's score cannot exceed the bull's by more than 3.0 points, maintaining balance between components. Because judges already evaluate in tenths informally, making .1 increments official aligns scoring with real practice, delivering greater accuracy, transparency, and fairness for fans, riders, and coaches as PBR enters 2026.

2026 PBR POINTS SYSTEMS – The 2026 PBR Unleash The Beast (UTB) season enters its eighth week of action in Salt Lake City, Utah, keeping the same elite tour point structure as 2025 but re-adding PBR Majors. The 2026 World Champion will be the rider who earns the most Unleash The Beast points. Points accumulated in non-UTB events domestically, as well as PBR's international tours, will be tallied as Velocity Global points. Velocity Global points, which will also be used to crown the 2026 PBR Pendleton Whisky Velocity Tour Champion, will help determine the athletes who can earn a future draw spot on the elite Unleash The Beast following the tour's first four events.

Those with the most points in the Velocity Global standings will join the UTB, replacing riders who fall to the bottom of the pack during select cuts throughout the season. The first rider cut takes place after the fourth UTB event in New York City, New York, on Jan. 9-11. Riders ranked in the No. 36-40 range in the UTB standings will be subject to being cut. During each cut, the open positions will first be filled with those riders having injury exemptions, followed by the leaders in the Velocity Global standings. Following the first cut, these riders will take the place of the demoted riders in the sport's top series to make up the 40-rider field heading into Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on Jan. 16-17. Riders ranked No. 1-35 on the UTB will remain on the PBR's elite tour. Following the initial cut, subsequent cuts will be held every two weeks. The second cut will drop the bottom six riders from UTB, the third cut will drop the bottom seven riders, and the fourth and remaining cuts will remove the bottom eight riders from UTB. If a rider is offered an invite to the UTB but declines, he will forgo any future UTB invites off the Velocity Global standings for the remainder of the season but is eligible to compete in the World Finals if he qualifies through the Velocity Tour.

Bonus points are awarded across all levels of PBR competition. A rider who scores 70-79.95 points will earn 7 bonus points, 80-89.95 8 bonus points and 90-99.95 9 bonus points. The exception is if a contestant declines a re-ride due to an inferior bull. In that case, he does not earn bonus points.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY – Round 1 of the PBR Salt Lake City presented by Busch Light in Salt Lake City will feature 10 rematches.

- Bob Mitchell looks to right the ship during a third attempt aboard OptiWize Mercy on Friday, most recently unsuccessful earlier this season in Chicago and initially sent to the dirt in December 2023.
- Callum Miller hopes to even the record at one win apiece after bucking off Bison in 2.01 seconds in June 2025.
- Daylon Swearingen prepares for an instant rematch against Big Country one week after the bull forced him into a touch at the 1.81-second mark during last weekend's Monster Energy Team Challenge in Sacramento.
- Ezekiel Mitchell readies for a second challenge against Electric Kitty after touching the bull 5.73 seconds into his attempt during their inaugural dance in April 2024. Alison dos Santos seeks revenge against Scrappy after being dispatched by the bull in a heartbreaking 7.94 seconds last month in Denver, Colorado.
- Hudson Bolton looks to improve to 2-0 all-time aboard Average Joe. The 2025 PBR Rookie of the Year originally bested the bull for 87.25 points in Glendale, Arizona last fall.
- Just three weeks after recording an 87.40-point conversion aboard the very same bovine in Denver, Colorado, John Crimber attempts to stay perfect aboard Snappy during Friday's opening round.
- Lucas Divino attempts to stay perfect atop Magic Hunter since first besting the bull for 89.75 points in January 2025.
- Marco Rizzo seeks revenge against Hard Candy for the first time since bucking off the animal athlete in 6.42 seconds last year in Anaheim California.

- Mauricio Gulla Moreira hopes to even the score against Smokey after being sent to the dirt in 3.14 seconds when the two first danced in Springfield, Missouri, last summer.

PAST SALT LAKE CITY EVENT WINNERS – PBR’s premier series returns to Salt Lake City for the seventh time this weekend, with Eduardo Aparecido earning the event win in 2025 the last time Unleash The Beast visited Delta Center. The veteran improved from No. 37 to the tour’s 18th-ranked rider courtesy of his first win on the season and fourth overall within UTB competition as one of two men to produce flawless 3-for-3 weekends. Taking home 127 UTB points for his first win since 2024, Aparecido paired an opening round ride aboard Off The Tracks for 87 points with a Round 2 conversion atop Buckaroo for 86.50 points. Ending the suspense-filled showcase in walk-off fashion when the short round dawned, Aparecido knocked a showdown with Ricky Vaughn out of the park, scored 90.25 points for the win.

WORLD CHAMPION BULL UPDATE – The 2026 YETI PBR World Champion Bull will be determined by both the 2025 PBR Teams league season and the 2026 Unleash The Beast season. The 2026 World Champion Bull will be determined by their Top 8 outs during the Teams season and UTB regular seasons and two outs at the PBR World Finals. The Top 7 eligible bulls at the end of a PBR UTB regular season shall be entered into the World Finals and be guaranteed three outs. In the event two or more bulls are tied based on the scoring criteria after the World Finals, the World Champion Bull shall be awarded to the bull who has achieved the highest average score from their two best outs at the World Finals. If a tie still exists after a review of the scores described, the bulls will share the title of World Champion Bull and the prize money will be evenly distributed among the stock contractors who own said bulls.

For avoidance of doubt, if the score that is dropped from the World Finals is higher than the lowest regular season out, the score at World Finals will still be dropped. The top eight (8) regular season outs, and top two (2) World Finals outs are to remain in the calculations for the World Champion Bucking Bull Award.

THIS WEEKEND’S FORMAT – PBR Salt Lake City presented by Busch Light, the eighth Unleash The Beast event of the 2026 season and second after the tour’s second cut, will feature three rounds of bull riding. Each of the 46 competing riders will get on one bull in Round 1 on Friday* and one bull in Round 2 on Saturday. The 12 bull riders with the top combined ride scores following Rounds 1-2 will then advance to the championship round following Round 2 on Saturday.

*Cleber Henrique Marques and JaCauy Hale need to ride night one to stay in the competition.

NEXT UP – The PBR Unleash The Beast heads to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, for U.S. Border Patrol PBR Pittsburgh presented by Ariat Friday, Feb. 13 and Saturday, Feb. 14. Both days of action are scheduled to begin at 8 p.m. ET.

PROVIDING PROTECTION – This weekend’s bull fighters are Lucas Teodoro of Pinhal, Brazil; Austin Ashley of Wynnewood, Oklahoma; and Cody Webster of Wayne, Oklahoma.

TELEVISION BROADCAST – All three rounds of action in Salt Lake City will be shown on Paramount+ in a new five-year deal signed with the streaming platform. This weekend’s action will be streamed on Paramount+ starting at 8 p.m. MT on Friday. The two Monster Energy Team Challenge games will air on CBS Television Network on Sunday, Feb. 8 at 10 a.m. MT.

VELOCITY TOUR, INTERNATIONAL AND TOURING PRO DIVISION POINTS – All non-Unleash The Beast (UTB) events award Velocity Global points, including Pendleton Whisky Velocity Tour events, Touring Pro Division events and events held internationally in Australia, Brazil, Canada, and Mexico. The only exception is National Finals held abroad, which will only award national points, not Velocity Global points. The point system at each event is tiered based on added money in USD, and other factors determined by the PBR. Each event, depending on the tier, will get points in accordance with the tables below.

- Tier 1 Events – \$20,000 or more USD in added money.
- Tier 2 Events – \$10,000 - \$19,999 USD in added money.
- Tier 3 Events – \$9,999 USD or less in added money.

Bonus points are awarded across all levels of PBR competition. A rider who scores 70-79.95 points will earn 7 bonus points, 80-89.95 8 bonus points and 90-99.95 9 bonus points. The exception is if a contestant declines a re-ride due to an inferior bull. In that case, he does not earn bonus points.
